

Example of a typical treatment cycle of IVF

Below is an example of what you can expect to pay for a full cycle of IVF, based on a typical cycle of IVF using your own eggs and your partner's sperm. This excludes any supplementary costs associated with alternative/additional services such as ICSI, donor sperm and donor eggs or EmbryoScope. Additional fees relating to alternative treatment plans are detailed on the Private Patient Pricing Guide.

* This treatment fee includes: HFEA fee, treatment planning with one of our fertility nurses, mock embryo transfer (if required), monitoring scans, in-treatment blood tests, sperm preparation, egg collection (with conscious sedation or local anaesthetic), embryo creation, culture to blastocyst++ and fresh embryo transfer, pregnancy scan, post-treatment review consultation, up to 3 support counselling sessions and 24/7 nurse on call support.

**Please note that these costs are based on a typical new patient IVF cycle; all patients have individual circumstances which may require additional investigations and/or procedures, equally patients may have already had recent, in date, investigations that do not need repeating. A fully costed treatment plan will be provided after investigations and a consultation have taken place.
